Outline India, with USAID, is undertaking a project on MOMENTUM Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity. This research project aims to assess the integration of COVID-19 vaccination with essential health services and the overall health system in eight countries. The assessment also covers various components such as management, financing, procurement, service delivery, data systems, and demand generation. It involves Tamil Nadu in India and states in seven other countries, facilitated by the collaborative efforts of the USAIDsupported MOMENTUM and HSSA projects, with the Ministry of Health.











Outline India is collaborating on a project with AIR and the study focuses on the relationship between the medium of instruction and students' success. It is geared around understanding how linguistic diversity in primary classrooms hinders or encourages students' academic growth, and the challenges faced by the schools, students, and community in pursuing multilingual teaching and learning processes.




Outline India, in collaboration with our partner, The Bridgespan Group, is undertaking a "State of the Sector" analysis to highlight the voice of vulnerable communities as it intersects with climate change, and proposes meaningful innovations to meet their needs.

This research is rooted in the understanding that **climate change** is accelerating by the year and has already exacerbated pre-existing vulnerabilities of the most marginalized communities. With this research, we hope to uncover some of these effects in the sphere of agriculture and aim to understand the effects of **climate change** on **smallholding farmers (especially women and SC/ST farmers)**, as well as identify potential solutions to address these challenges.







This project with the Indian School of Business across Gujarat and NCR was conducted wherein our team surveyed 30 doctors and 120 patients to support our Impact Assessment to understand the impact of TB care and treatment in the private healthcare system, and how healthcare schemes like JEET, and private healthcare providers like TATA1mg have fared in the fight to eliminate TB from India.





Outline is conducting a follow-up study with AIR. This particular vertical is part of a larger study conducted by OI with AIR a few months ago. It focused on the social and economic impact of organic and conventional cotton farming in the Barwani and Chhindwara districts of Madhya Pradesh. In this leg of the study, Outline India will be conducting surveys with organic cotton farmers to understand if their practices have been proving economically beneficial to farmers at the grassroots.







Outline India is the data collection partner for the World Resources Institute (WRI) India on a study that examines the relationship between migration and climate resilience in India across Kerala, Gujarat and Odisha, and attempts to document how climate events and slow onset processes are changing migration decisions and patterns. The study focuses on supporting informed and equitable policy-making for development, environmental justice, poverty reduction, and social inclusion by addressing a significant data and knowledge gap. The empirical data gathered through this study will help in filling the knowledge gap and sharpening understanding of this challenge and provide timely and relevant information for policy-makers, planners, development organizations, and researchers.

By investing in women, gains are made in poverty alleviation and fuelling sustainable economic growth. Till date, ACF has facilitated 3200 SHGs impacting over 37,000 women, 8 women federations and over 13,000 women have gone ahead and set up their own businesses.

It was a dynamic exchange with the students, unraveling the intricacies of conducting end-to-end studies.

<u>Prerna Mukharya</u>, Founder of <u>Outline India</u>, recently shared profound insights at the <u>Cape Town Conversation</u> in <u>South Africa</u>. Addressing a diverse audience, she delved into the crucial theme of <u>Data for Development</u>, highlighting the critical need to realign power structures globally, ensuring equitable influence between the global north and south.
