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## PROJECTS





**Location : Delhi, Bangalore, Noida, Nagpur**

The Wadhwani Skills Network's Incremental Placement Study, led by the Wadhwani Foundation, is a flagship program evaluating the impact of its Employability Program (EP) on placement outcomes across Delhi and other Hindi-speaking regions. With a sample of **3,000–4,000**, the study uses a mixed-methods approach to assess the incremental impact by comparing treatment and control groups across partner institutions. It also explores factors influencing employability, offering insights to refine and scale the program.

Outline India is supporting Wadhwani with **tool development, sampling, recruitment and training of enumerators, data collection, quality checks, analysis, and report writing**.



**Location : Kanpur and Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh**

Outline India is conducting a **mixed-methods impact assessment** across two districts of Uttar Pradesh to evaluate the **socio-economic impact of sewing machine distribution on women beneficiaries and their families**, focusing on usage, empowerment, challenges, and broader ripple effects within communities. The study supports Singer's initiative in collaboration with the **Government of Uttar Pradesh**, under **CM Yogi** - aiming to generate evidence that can inform and scale efforts to enhance women's livelihoods and agency.



Ipas

Location : Bhopal, Gwalior, Indore, and Jabalpur

Outline India, in collaboration with Ipas Development Foundation, leveraging its extensive expertise in reproductive health and public health systems, is conducting a qualitative study across Bhopal, Gwalior, Indore, and Jabalpur. The study involves in-depth interviews with key stakeholders, including government officials, healthcare providers, community health workers, and civil society actors. Guided by the **WHO Bottleneck Analysis framework**, the research will assess governance, financing, service delivery, and community engagement challenges and enablers in scaling up PAFP and PPFP services. OI will handle tool contextualization, field team training, **qualitative data collection, transcription, thematic and grid analysis, and comprehensive reporting** in close coordination with Ipas Development Foundation.

Location : Jodhpur,  
Rajasthan

The Endline Evaluation of the Literacy Instruction Scale-Up Program in Jodhpur and Barmer, Rajasthan, aims to assess the impact of Room to Read's (RtR) intervention on Grade 3 students' literacy skills using the **Early Grade Literacy Skills (EGLS) assessment tool**.

Conducted by Outline India (OI), the study will involve quantitative data collection across **160 schools (80 intervention and 80 control schools)**, focusing on reading fluency, comprehension, and writing abilities.

With a systematic approach to training enumerators, rigorous data quality checks, and the use of Inter-Rater Reliability (IRR) tests, the evaluation will generate empirical evidence to measure program effectiveness and inform future literacy interventions.


### Example: Turning Raw Counts into Actionable Percentages

Imagine a city survey finds 2,300 active street vendors in a district. At first glance, it is just a number. But when researchers:

- Link it to population data (say 1.2 million residents)
- Adjust for working-age population (~800,000)
- Standardise across cities (vendors per 1,000 working-age residents)
