Experimental Evidence of Women's Well-Being in Developing Countries





Outline India is collaborating on a study with **Boston University** to understand issues that women face concerning marriage, relationships in the household, health, and well-being.

The study aims to interact with 900 pairs of Mother-in-law and Daughter-in-law who are coresiding across 60-80 villages of Jaunpur district in Uttar Pradesh to understand their state of well-being in the areas of health, education, marriage, household roles, responsibilities, and further improve the delivery of public goods and services in the community for women.

Bringing an Equity Lens to Climate Investments in India ——

Outline India, in collaboration with our partner, The Bridgespan Group, is undertaking a "State of the Sector" analysis to highlight the voice of vulnerable communities as it intersects with climate change, and proposes meaningful innovations to meet their needs.

This research is rooted in the understanding that climate change is accelerating by the year and has already exacerbated pre-existing vulnerabilities of the most marginalized communities. With this research, we hope to uncover some of these effects in the sphere of agriculture and aim to understand the effects of climate change on smallholding farmers (especially women and SC/ST farmers), as well as identify potential solutions to address these challenges.

This project with the **Indian School of Business** across **Gujarat** and **NCR** was conducted wherein our team surveyed **30 doctors and 120 patients** to support our Impact Assessment to understand the impact of TB care and treatment in the private healthcare system, and how healthcare schemes like **JEET**, and private healthcare providers like **TATA1mg** have fared in the fight to eliminate TB from India.



Strengthening the leadership of elected women representatives to become effective leaders



Taking data collection practices to the next level




We took our data collection practices to the next level in an endline assessment, leveraging <u>SurveyCTO's</u> features for phone surveys.


